Located in Regina, SASS provides a collective voice provincially and nationally for front-line agencies working to end sexual violence in Saskatchewan. SASS provides resources, training, support and advocacy for member agencies, manages public awareness and education campaigns, and conducts research and consultations on issues related to sexual violence.
