As organizations face increasing pressure to foster safe and inclusive environments, this event offers a proactive, solutions-focused platform for Saskatchewan’s leaders to transition from reactive policies to active culture management.

Key Highlights

- **Keynote by Cadmus Delorme:** The former Chief of Cowessess First Nation and current Chair of the University of Regina Board of Governors will share insights on blending traditional values with modern leadership to drive reconciliation and unity.
- **Expert Training with Jackson Katz, Ph.D.:** Internationally renowned educator and author of the just-released book *Every Man: Why Violence Against Women is a Men’s Issue*.
- Dr. Katz will conduct leadership training with a special focus on the role of male leaders in the promotion of gender equity and the prevention of harassment, abuse, and violence.
- Katz will include instruction on the “bystander approach” to prevention; he is one of the early architects of this popular strategy.
- **Provincial Support:** The event will feature opening remarks from the **Honourable Ken Cheveldayoff**, Minister of Labour Relations and Workplace Safety, highlighting the province’s commitment to workplace accountability.
